302 FRUIT CLASS

Fruits are shown on white paper plates provided by the exhibitor and there should be three specimens unless otherwise designates by the schedule below. All fruits should be uniform in size, shape and color and free from insect damage. They should be shown ripe. They should be shown with natural bloom (the waxy substance that covers fruit). Apples and pears must have stems
