

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK DAIRY GOATS RULES

1. See Junior Division General Livestock Rules
2. Classes: Dry Does, Milk Does, and Wethers
3. Animals entered in the Youth Dairy Goat Show are not required to be registered with the American Dairy Goat Association.
4. Exhibitors are required to wear white or black pants with a white shirt while exhibiting animals in the ring. No sandals or tank tops are allowed.
5. All animals must be disbudded with scurs no bigger than 1½ inches (no horns).
6. Ear and tail web tattoos will be checked and must correspond with tattoos recorded on day of tagging.
7. All dairy goats must be declared in writing, and tattoos recorded on the day of tagging. If not registered with AGS or ADGA, animals will be tattooed with 4-H or FFA in the right ear and a number in their left ear (or on tail webs) on tagging day. Any exhibitor who wishes to show an animal that has not been born by the day of tagging must register and declare the dam on that day. As soon as they are able to be tattooed, contact the 4-H agent or FFA teacher to record the tattoo. Tattoos may be phoned in to the 4-H agent or FFA teacher. It is not necessary for the does to be present on the day of tagging unless they need to be tattooed. Declaration to show includes the class being entered.
8. The classes may be combined or divided into breeds and ages, as the Superintendent deems necessary.
